PRASAD Chikitsa was incorporated in 1994 but it really began in the 1960s with the dilapidated houses rebuilt for 1000 poor families and the critically important medical hospital travelling to villages in the 70s. Initially much of the work was done by volunteers, including Australians, who offered their professional services on the bus or in the eye camp tents on rice fields. Today that is not necessary but it would not be possible for PRASAD Chikitsa to offer the extraordinarily wide diversity of services it does without your generosity. - 95% success rate in curing tuberculosis (10% higher than government target)
- Malnutrition rate dropped from 43% to 17% among children
- 168,000 nutritional servings
- 68,000 medical visits
- 187 water filters distributed
- 92 toilets constructed

RECENT EXAMPLES OF ACTIVITIES AT PRASAD Chikitsa

PRASAD Chikitsa is always very active. Here are a few of the people who have been helped recently and how PRASAD Chikitsa engages people and organisations in their programs.



Rutika was diagnosed with Tuberculosis in early April 2019. She was immediately started on treatment in the Tuberculosis program. In the monthly follow ups, she showed improvement in every visit until she was finally declared cured.

In October, PRASAD Chikitsa helped these village women collect the relevant documents to register their names for PAN (permanent account number) cards which are mandatory for all banking and financial activities and government schemes.





In 2018, five tribal farmers joined PRASAD Chikitsa's Wadi (fruit orchard) program aiming to create a sustainable livelihood. Prakash Jogari is one of them. "I am so delighted to get support to achieve my dream of having my own fruit orchard. Thank you PRASAD Chikitsa". All of his good quality saplings are surviving.

The Art and Craft program encourages the preservation of the culture of Tansa Valley . Teaching Warli art and craft resulted from the need to preserve their rich artistic heritage. These skills translate into jobs, creating economic prosperity for the family and community. Arpit and Ganesh once said "Besides the PRASAD Chikitsa Art & Crafts centre, nobody teaches children about Warli painting." However this has changed as it is taught in schools now.





Sixty year old Mira's family faced a lot of hardships without a toilet. When PRASAD Chikitsa helped this family, the issue of their health and the inconvenience had improved but just as important was a new-found sense of dignity. 'Without PRASAD Chikitsa's support and encouragement, it would never have been possible for us to have a toilet.'

The Rotary Club of Kandivali and the Rotary Club of Bombay donated a YAG Laser machine to Gurudev Siddha Peeth Nitraprakasha Hospital for the ophthalmology department. The guests were impressed with the quality of work done at GSPNH after visiting the Medical Centre, especially the Pharmacy, and then at the Opthamology Department where they learnt how the department worked.





Last month "UK Charities", in partnership with PRASAD Chikitsa in the HIV Program since August 2018, have helped with expenses towards Lab disposables for HIV testing, nutritional supplements and medicines for the treatment of infections in HIV patients. After seeing all aspects of the HIV program they were treated to an overview of all the programs run by PRASAD Chikitsa raising their awareness of the wide-ranging support given to the people of the Tansa Valley.



WHAT NEXT FOR PRASAD CHIKITSA?

PRASAD Chikitsa is engaged in an in-depth evaluation of its current programs. It is also surveying Tansa Valley villagers to learn how to expand programming to meet needs not currently being addressed. The state of the environment, which has degraded over the last several years, is also being reviewed to determine how best we can contribute to its restoration. As always, a professional and caring approach is taken in all planning with the needs of the villagers as the top priority.



How you can help
